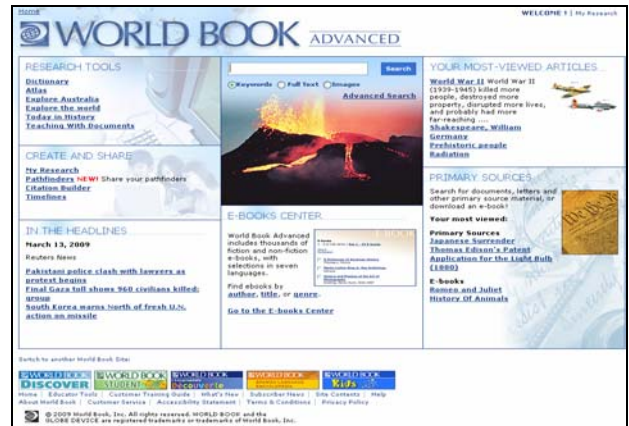


# WORLD BOOK WEB

- **World Book Advanced** is a powerful reference tool that includes encyclopedia, multimedia, e-book, and primary source databases, fully integrated in a single search.



- Go to *World Book Advanced* Home Page by clicking the **World Book Advanced** image.

### CREATE AND SHARE

Find the **Create and Share** section on the left hand side of the home page. Click on **My Research**. Set up your account. **Save every site you go to in the following searches in your research file so you can go back to them anytime.**

**Notes can be added or deleted at anytime in My Research by clicking on {add note}.**

Go back to **Home** page.

### SEARCH

Search for **Albert Einstein**.

1. Read about the general information on his life to find the answer to the question below. Go to the **Einstein, Albert** article in the **Encyclopedia Articles**. **Save to My Research**.

What instrument did Albert Einstein play throughout his life?

2. Click on the picture of Albert Einstein. **Save to My Research**.
3. Read about his theory of relativity in easy to understand language to find the answer to the question below. Click on **Back to Search Results**. Go to the article on **Relativity** in the **Encyclopedia Articles** section. **Save to My Research**.

Einstein used ideas from a principle of relativity developed by which Italian astronomer and physicist?

4. You can read Einstein's theories in his own words. To find the answer to the question below click on **Back to Search Results**. Go to the **Primary Sources** section of the search results page and find the link to **General Results of the Theory of Relativity – by Albert Einstein**. Check the box and **Save to My Research**.
5. Find the **Albert Einstein** article in the **Encyclopedia** section. In the **Article Contents** on the left, find **Later Years > Letter to President Roosevelt**.  
What was the importance of a letter Einstein wrote to President Roosevelt in 1939?

6. Read the letter Einstein wrote to President Roosevelt to find the answer to the question below. Click **Back to Search Results**. Go to the **Primary Sources** section on the right side of the page find **Public Papers of Franklin D. Roosevelt – Einstein's Atomic Bomb Proposal**, check box and **Save to My Research**.  
What element was Albert Einstein suggesting might be turned into a new and important source of energy? \_\_\_\_\_
  7. Go to the Albert Einstein article in the **Related Information** section, click on the **Special Reports** link and find **The Search for Gravity Waves**. **Save to My Research**.
  8. Go back to the **Search Results** page and find the link to **Back in Time** to discover what was written about Einstein's theories in **1929**. It was written during the year in which the events took place and reflects the style and thinking of that time. **Save to My Research**.
  9. For still more information, go back one page and click on **Web Sites**. (Don't worry, you are not going to find hundreds of thousands, just the best of the best!) **Check all** and **Save to My Research**.
  10. Go to **My Research**. Under **Manage your Project** click **Edit title** and rename your project to *Albert Einstein*.

## **E-BOOKS & LITERARY CRITICISM**

Go to **E-Books Centre** box on *World Book Advanced Home* page.

To access thousands of E-Books, you can either:

1. Search by **author**, **title** or **genre**.
2. Click on **Go to the E-book Centre** with two search options (i) **Search E-books** (ii) **OR select from one or more categories**.
3. In **Search** box by title or author for a specific book. The **E-books** and **Literary Criticism** will appear on the right hand side.

From **Home** page, search for **Shakespeare**.

1. In the **E-book** section select two works written by Shakespeare and **Save to My Research**. See **1 – 15 E-books** for further works.
  2. Go to the article **Hamlet** in the **Encyclopedia Articles**. **Save to My Research**.  
What is the full title of the play?

Click **Back to Search Results**

3. If you have a test tomorrow on **Hamlet** and have left your book at school, enter the title in the search box. What do you find in **Search Results** under **E-books**?  
**Save to My Research**.

4. Find a critical analysis of Hamlet by clicking on **Literary Criticism** under **Search Results** on the left hand side of the page. **Check all** and **Save to My Research**.
5. Go to **My Research**. Under **Manage your Project** click **Edit title** and rename your project to *Shakespeare*.

## **RESEARCH TOOLS**

From **Home** page, search for **World War II**. Save the following to a new project in your research:

1. **Primary Sources**. Japanese Surrender.
2. **Literary Criticism**. Catholic Historical Review - Review of The Second World War: The Gathering Storm
3. **Tables**. Military casualties in World War II (1939-1945).
4. **Sounds**. Eyewitness account of the bombing of Nagasaki.
5. **Historical Maps**. World War II in the Pacific: 1943-1945.
6. **Pictures**. Japanese detention camps during World War II.
7. **Videos**. Adolf Hitler and the rise of the Nazi Party.
8. **Back in Time**. World War II (1945).
9. **Special Reports**. The World Remembers D-Day.
10. **Web Sites**. World War II Documents.
11. **Timelines**. World War II: Europe and northern Africa
12. Go to **My Research**. Under **Manage your Project** click **Edit title** and rename your project to *World War II*.

## **TIMELINES**

Go to the **Home** page of *World Book Advanced* and click on the **Timelines** link in the **Create and Share** section.

1. Click on **Create New Timelines**
2. Go to **Search World Book Events** button, enter **World War II** and click **Search Events**.
3. Select 20 events for your timeline
4. View Timeline
5. Save to My Research

## **CITATION BUILDER**

Go to the **Home** page of *World Book Advanced*.

Create the perfect bibliography every time.

1. Click on **Citation Builder** link in the **Create and Share** section.
  2. Select the Citation type from the dropdown list -  
**Submit**
  3. Once you have completed the selection of fields you will be issued with citations in a number of formats with the option to print, email or save. Write down the bibliography you created.

## **PATHFINDERS**

Pathfinders are like resource guides, but created on popular curriculum topics and include primary source documents.

From *World Book Advanced* home page, go to the **Pathfinders** link in the **Create and Share** section.

Under **World Book Pathfinders** select **Ancient Greece**.

1. Save one of the Primary source documents to your research.
2. Save articles that look most interesting to you to your research.
3. Go to **My Research**. Under **Manage your Project** click **Edit title** and rename your project to *Ancient Greece*.
