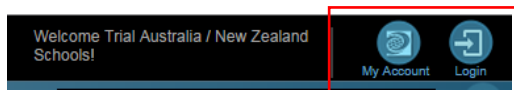

- Click "Create an Event" to enter in an event

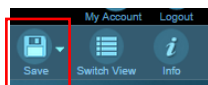


- Provide the date and summary of the event that happened during that time. You can add images and additional facts about the event too.
