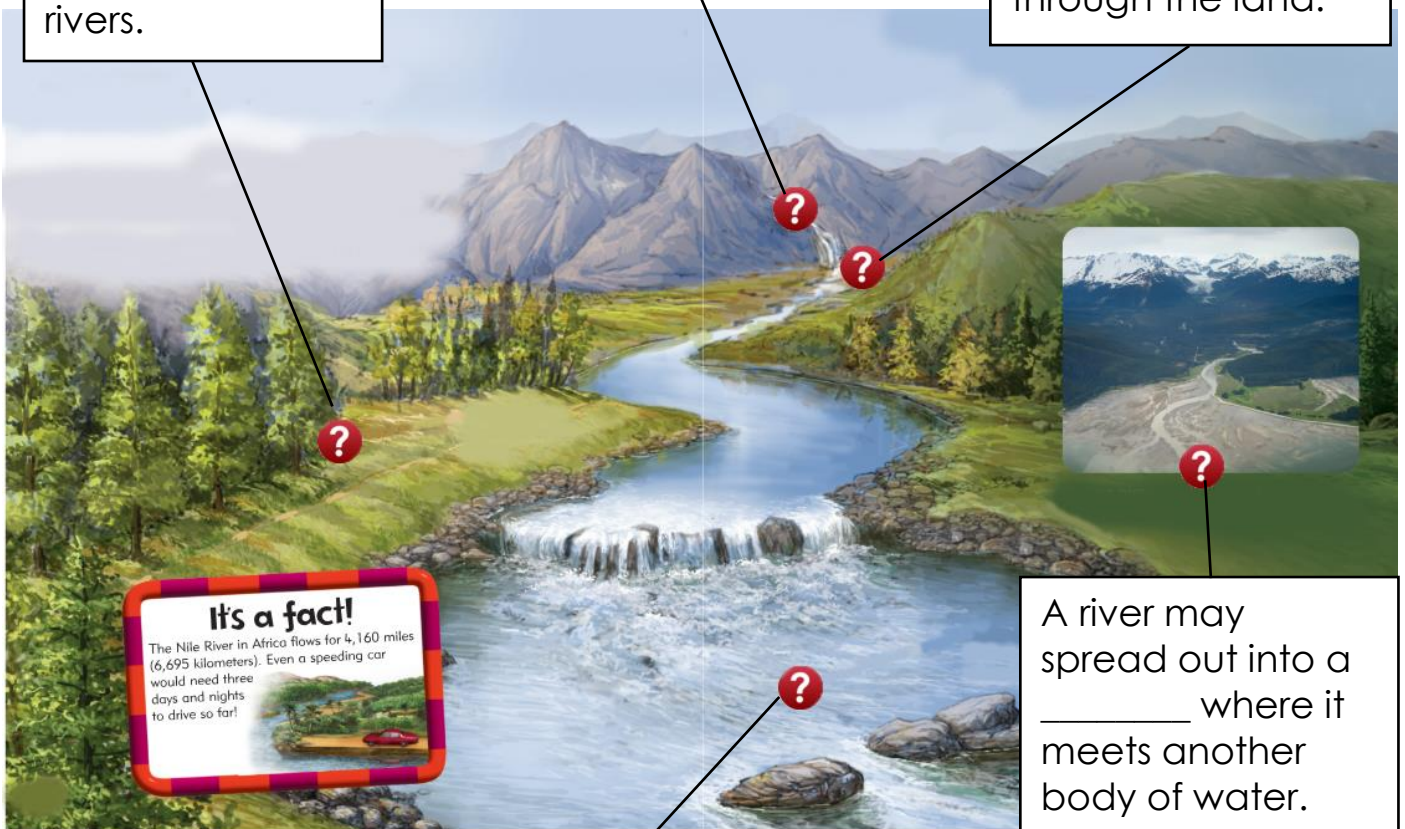


A river is a large stream of water that flows over \_\_\_\_\_.
