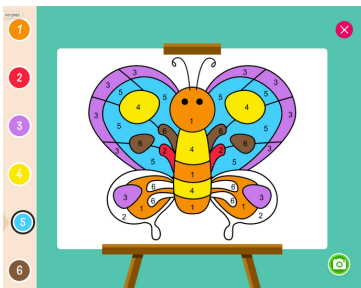

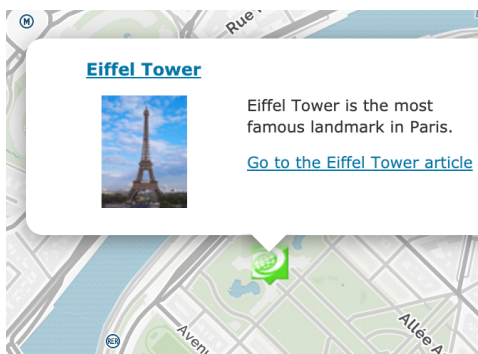

STRAWBERRY JAM Makes 2 cups

INGREDIENTS

2 cups fresh strawberries, washed and chopped with hulls and stems removed 1/2 cup sugar
2 tbsp. fresh lemon juice

STEPS


1. HAVE AN ADULT cook the strawberries, sugar, and lemon juice in a saucepan over medium-high heat, mashing the strawberries while stirring. Cook until bubbles cover the surface of the jam, about 10 minutes. The jam is ready when the consistency is like a thick maple syrup or the temperature reaches 220 °F (104 °C).

2. Let cool and spoon into a container with a lid. It will keep in the refrigerator for 2 weeks.



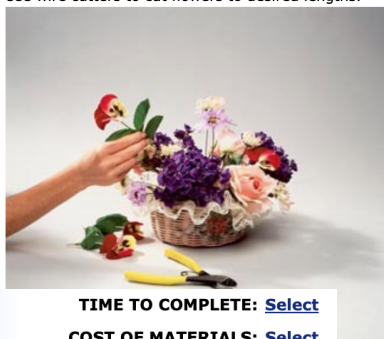
Time for Crafts!
