16. After being found guilty, Ned Kelly was hanged in Melbourne jail on what date?

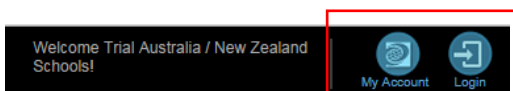

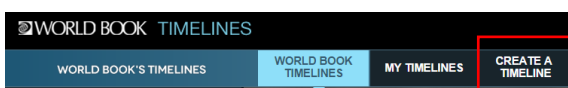

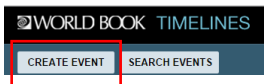
- Log in to your My Research Account using your personalised log in details – this is how you save your Timeline

- Provide the date and summary of the event that happened during that time. You can add images and additional facts about the event too.

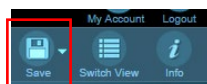

1841	Ned Kelly's father, John Kelly was convicted of pig stealing in Ireland.	John Kelly was sent to Van Diemen's Land to serve his sentence.
1854	Edward (Ned) Kelly was born in Beveridge, near Melbourne, Victoria.	-
1864	The Kelly family moved to Avenel in central Victoria	-
1866	Following John Kelly's death, the Kelly family moved to Greta, north-east Victoria.	-
1866	Ned's father, John Kelly, died.	
1870	Ned Kelly was convicted of assault.	Ned Kelly was sentenced to 6 months in prison.
1871 - 1874	Ned Kelly was convicted of receiving a stolen horse and sent to prison for 3 years.	The police officer who arrested Kelly for this offense brutally beat him with a pistol.
1874	Ned Kelly was released from prison.	Following his period in jail, Ned Kelly led an honest life for three years, before turning to horse and cattle theft.

1878	Kelly Gang killed three police officers	Following the incident with police officer, Andrew Fitzpatrick, Ned and his brother Dan fled to the bush. An order to capture or kill the Kelly brother's was issued. Whilst trying to capture Ned and his brother, three police officers were killed.
February 1879	Kelly Gang raided the town of Jerilderie.	-
June 1880	Kelly Gang took over Glenrowan resulting in a siege with police officers.	All of Kelly's Gang were killed except Ned. Ned escaped but returned to rescue his companions. Ned Kelly was then captured and arrested.
October 1880	Ned Kelly stood trial for murder.	-
Nov. 11, 1880	Ned Kelly was hanged in Melbourne Jail.	-
